

# **SPIRIT TALKER**

## **Season 3 - Episode Synopses**

### **Eps. 301 - Fort William First Nation, ON**

Shawn travels to Fort William First Nation to meet Gail Bannon and Audrey Deroy and learns how to strip bark “Wiigwass” from “the tree of life and crafts a traditional birch bark basket. During Shawn’s spirit sessions, a young woman connects with a lost child and a family in Spirit lines up to be heard.

### **Eps. 302 - Lake Helen First Nation, ON**

Shawn goes fishing for Walleye on Fraser Lake with local guide Alan Odawa. During his reading, a grandmother has a comforting message for her granddaughter, and a best friend makes an important connection.

### **Eps. 303 - Michipicoten First Nation, ON**

Shawn travels to the eastern shores of Lake Superior to Michipicoten, a community reclaiming sacred spaces and traditions. In the readings a powerful connection is made between a man and his best friend, and joyful reunion for a mother and her daughters.

### **Eps. 304 - Batchewana First Nation, ON**

Shawn takes a walk into the past when he explores the cliffs overhanging Agawa Bay with Chief Dean Sayers as his guide to view centuries-old pictographs. A reading gets off on the right foot with a family of pow wow dancers, and Shawn’s psychic abilities are tested.

### **Eps. 305 - Sagamok First Nation, ON**

Shawn travels to the north shore of Lake Huron, to Sagamok First Nation, where he’s welcomed by Chief Alan Ozawanimki and Patricia Toulouse. Patricia takes Shawn on a medicine walk, gathering medicinal ingredients along the trail. In the spirit readings, a father comes through for his daughter, and a powerful connection is made for two brothers.

### **Eps. 306 - Atikameksheng First Nation, ON**

In Atikameksheng First Nation, Shawn meets Riel Dumont and lends a hand in the construction of a traditional lodge. During a reading, a young woman receives some grandfatherly guidance, and a spirit connection packs an emotional punch for a man.

### **Eps. 307 - M’Chigeeng First Nation, ON**

Shawn travels to M’chigeeng First Nation in the middle of Manitoulin island, where he meets cultural knowledge keeper Josh Eshkawkogan, and learns the teachings of the sacred fire. A message from a lost brother comes through in spirit, and a family of a different kind makes contact.

### **Eps. 308 - Wiikwemkong First Nation, ON**

Shawn travels to Lake Huron’s Georgian Bay to Wiikwemkong First Nation on Manitoulin Island. He meets with Norman Assiniwe who takes Shawn beaver trapping and then shows him how to make beaver mittens. The spirit of a father is encouraging his son to stay strong, and the voice of a spirit comes booming through.

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### **Eps. 309 - Tyendinaga First Nation, ON**

Shawn makes his way to southeastern Ontario to Tyendinaga, a First Nation with a long history of agriculture. Here he visits a seed sanctuary, a community farm collective established to grow, save, and protect rare seeds. Decades after his passing, the spirit of a young child makes a powerful connection, and a mother sends a strong message to her daughters.

### **Eps. 310 - Georgina Island First Nation, ON**

Shawn takes the ferry to Lake Simcoe's Georgina Island where he meets Vicky Wolske and takes part in a seasonal water ceremony. The spirit of a father who died tragically helps save a life, and a young musician receives a powerful message.

### **Eps. 311 - Kanesatake First Nation, QC**

Shawn travels to the Mohawk Territory of Kanesatake located on the shores of the Lake of Two Mountains in southwestern Quebec. There he meets with Tionatakwente Lacrosse owner, Travis Gabriel who teaches Shawn how to make a traditional handcrafted lacrosse stick. During his Spirit session, a mother gets unexpected news from spirit, and rare connection emerges.

### **Eps. 312 - Kahnawake Mohawk Territory, QC**

Shawn travels to Kahnawake, Mohawk Territory located on the south shores of the Saint Lawrence River. He meets Eric McComber who takes him ice fishing and then David McComber demonstrates traditional fire making techniques. The spirit of a grandmother is taking over a reading, and a son has important message for his mother.

### **Eps. 313 - Kitigan Zibi Anishinabeg First Nation, QC**

Shawn makes his way to Kitigan Zibi Anishinabeg First Nation near the Gatineau river. Shawn meets Mike Diabo, who along with his students, show Shawn the traditional methods of harvesting, boiling and enjoying maple syrup. A mother's Spirit is setting the record straight, and a grandmother is keeping watch over her unborn great-grandchild.
